The City has started making some changes to the Dogs Off Leash Area in Callingwood Park. After consulting with some of the dog owners who use the area, the City decided to implement the following improvements:

- New parking lot lines were painted in July, including two handicap parking stalls
- Frequency of garbage can cleaning has increased
- Signs were added and moved to help clarify where the dog off leash park actually starts and ends

- · New bag dispensers will be added at some of the new signs
- Picnic tables in the Off Leash Area have been removed and replaced by benches, so the social aspect can still take place without the disturbance caused by food in a dog park

City staff are planning to do an educational session with surrounding schools and the YMCA and local daycares this fall, to educate children about safe and responsible behaviour in the Dogs Off Leash Area.

The City also started a city-wide Dogs Off Leash Ambassador Program this summer. Dogs Off Leash Ambassadors are volunteers who aim to encourage a sense of community at their local off leash area, by actions such as encouraging responsible dog ownership, monitoring the park, and communicating with City staff to address problems. As of July there were two trained Ambassadors in Callingwood/Lymburn, and six other volunteers awaiting training. If you'd like to volunteer, search for "Dogs Off Leash Ambassador Program" on the City of Edmonton's website.

The City is continuing to talk to members of the dog owner community in the park throughout the summer. The information gathered will help the City continue to work together with the users to make the Callingwood Dogs Off Leash Area an awesome place for owners and their dogs to visit.

Results of the 2014 Outdoor Soccer Season

I was able to get out and see most of the teams play and was quite impressed with the results of the coaches and players for the most part. There were many of the teams experimenting with the offences and defences that they would like to have in place. Some of the teams progressed quicker than others and had some good results over all.

In the U4, U5 and U6 age groups we had eight teams all together. There were 2 - U4 teams, 4 - U5 teams, and 2 - U6 teams. All the teams were made up of both girls and boys. What really impressed me through all these ages was the dribbling skills the players had learned and the number of goals they scored in a half hour game.

In the U8 age bracket we had 3 teams, one of which had 4 girls and 8 boys and the other 2 teams had 12 boys on each. In discussions with the coaches they felt that their teams did very well considering they don't keep track of the number of goals scored. It was quite concerning to me that there were so few girls registered, when in the past we had at least 2 girls teams and 2 or 3 boys teams.

The U10 girls team did very well, winning Tier IV in the community level and ending up in the Zone Finals where they won Gold Medals. They progressed to the City Finals in which they ended up tied for points with a team that they beat handily but because of a goal difference of 1 they did not win a Bronze Medal.

The U10 boys did not fare too well due to inexperience, and lack of ball handling skills. They showed improvement by the third round with the scores much closer than in the first two rounds.

The U12 girls had an experience much like the U10 boys, but came on as they learned some

skills and learned how to play defensively. The results were much closer in the last round than in the first 2 rounds. Many of these players were first year players and expect to do much better in the Indoor Soccer Season.

Our U12 boys team came second in Tier IV and qualified for Zone Finals winning Silver Medals. They went on to City Finals and lost a couple of close games.

The U14 girls won a spot in the Tier V Zone Finals and won Silver Medals, but only one team was destined to go to City Finals from that tier.

The U14 boys won a spot in the Tier VI in the Zone Finals but did not participate because of the team decision not to participate in Post Season play.

The U16 girls team decided not to pursue Post Season Play possibly because they were playing in the U18 level of soccer. They spent the year in Tiers 4 and 5 which are the highest level of Community Soccer. Overall they did quite well. Their record over 3 rounds was 5 Wins, 3 Ties and 7 Losses. This team has done very well over the past 5 or 6 Seasons of both Indoor and Outdoor Soccer.

The U18 girls team ended the season with Silver Medals in the City Finals. They are now off to Tier IV Provincials in Calgary on July 25 - 27. We wish them well. After this season we are hoping that they will be able to form a team in the Edmonton Women's Soccer League. Many thanks to all the coaches, asst. coaches, managers and parents who made this a successful, fun time for your kids.

All in all it was a good Spring Season. Mother Nature didn't cause too many rain outs and the season ended on schedule.

Enjoy the rest of the summer and we will see you in September.
